Mutually Beneficial Partnership

 Mutually beneficial opportunity to engage with James Reece Career and Technical Center (the Center)

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- continued need to recruit and retain highly skilled, technical positions, HVAC, automotive, electrical
- Leveraging community talent to address city challenges
- Connecting classroom skills to real world experiences

A Mutually Beneficial Partnership (cont.)

- Creating a talent pipeline for the future
 - preparing students to enter the workforce with developed skillsets

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 Pilot projects/programs that benefit both parties, i.e. Fleet and the Center

Partnership Scope

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Students at the Center will work on preventative maintenance on the city's light-duty trucks and vehicles This fleet consists of:

- non-public safety related vehicles
- initial pilot will include F-150s
- opportunity to expand in the future

Partnership Scope (cont.)

- Pilot program initial agreement term is one year and can be evaluated on a yearly basis
- COSL Fleet Services will schedule available slots and provide material and parts for the basic services
- COSL vehicle operator will drop off equipment and await completion of preventative maintenance service

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Fleet Partnership Benefits

Other benefits the Fleet Services anticipates include:

- efficiency for Fleet staff to address high priority repairs
- showcasing this profession to aspiring students
- expediting routine/basic maintenance of city fleet
- exchanging diagnostic information and scope of work recommendations through supervisory feedback from the center

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Account Funding Management

Funding will be through each respective department's existing repair and maintenance account

- Partnership does not change the current funding structure
- Account transfers are still billed by department
- Shop Manager from the center will provide monthly statements for review and payment for all work completed

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Council authorize the execution of an Interlocal Agreement between the City's Fleet Division and Fort Bend Independent School District's James Reece Career and Technical Center to establish a pilot program for preventative maintenance services.
