

RESOLUTION NO. 23-44

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUGAR LAND, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY (DHS), FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA), THROUGH THE STATE OF TEXAS OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (HSGP), URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE (UASI), AND DESIGNATING THE CITY MANAGER, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AS AUTHORIZED GRANT OFFICIAL TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, REJECT, ALTER, OR TERMINATE THE GRANT AND TO EXECUTE ALL GRANT DOCUMENTS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sugar Land (“City”) finds it in the best interest of the citizens of the City to submit an application to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), through the State of Texas Office of the Governor, for the Fiscal Year 2024 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP), Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), to enhance local government ability to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from terrorist attacks; NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SUGAR LAND, TEXAS:**

Section 1. That it adopts the findings and recitals set forth in the preamble to this Resolution.

Section 2. That it authorizes the submission of a grant application to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), through the State of Texas Office of the Governor, for the Fiscal Year 2024 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP), Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) to assist local efforts in preventing, preparing for, protecting against, and responding to acts of terrorism.

Section 3. That the City Manager, or his designee, is designated as authorized grant official to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate the grant and to execute all necessary agreements, assurances, certifications, and other grant documents on behalf of the City of Sugar Land.

Section 4. That the City agrees to provide any matching funds as required by the UASI grant.

Section 5. That in the event of loss or misuse of any UASI funds awarded to the City under the grant, the City assures that the awarded grant funds will be returned to the State of Texas Office of the Governor in full.
