Census Background & Preparation



Census Background

- Decennial Census April 1, 2020
- Mandated by U.S. Constitution, conducted every 10 years
- Establishes population counts and demographics across the country
- Serves as the basis for
 - Reapportioning congressional seats
 - Federal, state, and local redistricting
 - Distributing more than \$675 billion in federal funds annually to states, counties and local communities – housing, education, transportation, etc.

Census and Sugar Land

- Demographics and population used for planning purposes
- Census population serves as the basis for
 - Emergency management grant applications
 - Regional transportation & mobility improvements
 - Determining peer cities for comparison
 - City Council single-member districts



2020 Census



- It's quick, easy, and safe to respond any time, anywhere
 - Technology will make it easier than ever for individuals to respond to the census
 - Respond online, by phone, or by mail
- Staff preparations under way since 2017





Census Preparation – Address List

Efforts to ensure every household receives a survey

- Local Update of Census Addresses Operation (LUCA)
 - Decennial updates to Census residential address list
 - Completed summer 2018
- New Construction Program (NCP)
 - Fall 2019 final opportunity to provide input for residential address list





Census Preparation – Geographical Boundaries

- Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)
 - Annual updates to city boundaries
 - Completed January 2019
 - Includes Greatwood & New Territory
- Participant Statistical Areas Program (PSAP)
 - Opportunity to review Census Tracts and Block Groups
 - Make recommendations for those that need to be split
 - Goals: (1) keep Sugar Land city limits/ETJ together; (2) keep neighborhoods together

Complete Count Committee

- CCCs are "census ambassadors" that promote participation in the census
- Trusted leaders and voices within the community
- All-inclusive, addressing the various racial, ethnic, cultural and geographic considerations of the community
- Plan and implement outreach campaigns that raise awareness of the census
 - Utilize variety of mediums to get the word out





Committee membership & creation

- 2-3 reps from groups within Sugar Land, including
 - Faith-based community
 - Community/ nonprofit organizations
 - School district & education sector
 - Business/ employment community
 - Additional at-large members

Shape vour future



- City Manager Task Force
 - Establish in early August
 - Streamlined process
 - Application and Interview process
- IG reviewed the proposed process and concurred on 5/21/19



- CCC creation, orientation & develop outreach campaign
- Awareness Phase January February 2020
 - CCC & staff implements outreach campaign
