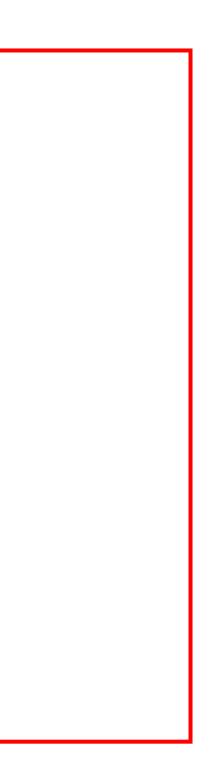

 - 701.96 acres around intersection of US 59 and University Blvd.
 - **5 member Board with 4 City representatives and 1 County** representative (if they elect to participate)
 - **City contributes 50% of increment**
 - **Contributions begin 2010, Zone expires 2039**
- **Creation Ordinance amended by Ordinance 1807 in December 2010**
 - Added 4 Board positions for possible participation of Drainage District, MUD 137, MUD 138, and MUD 139
 - Acreage decreased to 698 to remove residential plats

Substantial Interest in a business entity

You have a Substantial Interest in a business entity if you, your spouse, your parent or your child:

- Own 10% or more of the voting stock, shares or fair market value
- Own \$15,000 or more of the fair market value
- Received funds from the business entity exceeding 10% of your gross income for the previous year



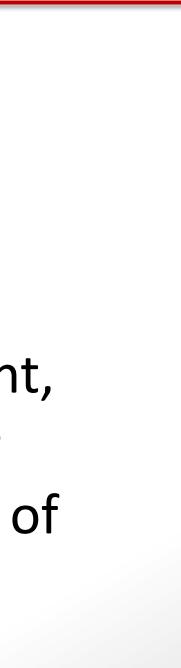


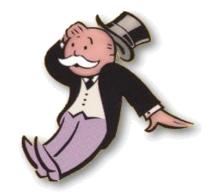


Substantial Interest in real property

You have a Substantial Interest in real property if your, your spouse, your parent, or your child's interest is an equitable or legal ownership with a fair market value of \$2,500 or more

- Abstain from participation in, discussion of and vote on the matter
- Affidavit must be filed PRIOR to discussion or vote on the matter



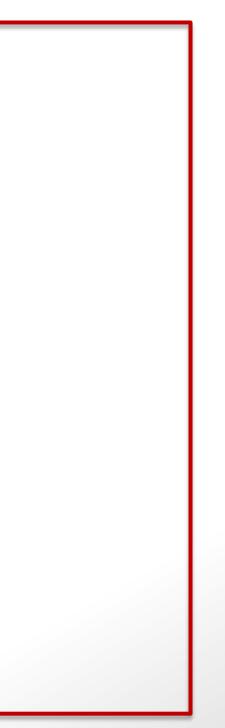

- When the cumulative value of Gifts received from the vendor reaches \$100

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Each year the TIRZ No. 4 Board will adopt a budget for the upcoming fiscal year, which runs from October 1 to September 30. The budget is presented to the Board for consideration upon receipt of the certified incremental values and proposed tax rates for each participating entity.

Fiscal Year 2021

The Zone is anticipated to bring in revenues of \$1,044,113 for FY21, which is \$66,054.00 less than budgeted. This includes \$1,041,113 in incremental taxes with an estimated \$3,000.00 in interest income. Expenditures are projected at \$266,058.00, including the recent budget amendment for design work related to the Brazos River Turnaround Alternate Roadway approved by the board in August. This leaves an anticipated ending fund balance of \$5,837,692 for FY21.

Fiscal Year 2022

Revenues for FV22 are estimated based on the proposed tax rates for each participating entity and

the certified tax roll from the Fort Bend Central Appraisal District, including any abatements and exemptions. Total revenues are estimated at \$1,231,509, including interest income. The FY22 property tax revenues are based on the following incremental values and tax rates:

**MUD 138 and MUD 139 contributions to the Zone are equal to the amount collected on one half of the City's tax rate.*

Proposed expenditures for FY22 total \$62,441.00, of which \$50,000.00 is allocated towards legal support services and \$12,441.00 allocated towards administrative support services. The FY22 proposed budget shows an ending fund balance of \$7,006,760.

Staff recommends the approval of amending the FY21 budget to projections and approval of the Fiscal Year 2022 budget as proposed. Following approval by the Board, in accordance with the TIRZ No. 4 creation ordinance, the budget must be approved by City Council before it becomes effective.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone No. Four (TIRZ No. 4) was created in 2009 to include about 698 acres around the intersection of University Boulevard and U.S. Highway 59, including the southern Telfair commercial tracts and the University of Houston. Home to the Smart Financial Centre at Sugar Land, the developing Zone features residential housing, a 317-unit multi-family residential facility, office, and retail. The Zone also has plans for a dense, office-entertainment centric development around the Smart Financial Centre, which will also be the location of the City's future hotel & convention (conference) center project. While the Zone continues to develop, the TIRZ No. 4 development update will annually provide the Board on the continuing expansion and growth in the area as well as ongoing planning efforts.
