- City Council Approved Resolution No. 17-12 on May 2
  - Requesting the County Add the City's Identified Transportation Projects to the List
- Proposed Bond Project List Published July 5
  - All Requested City Projects Included on List
  - Revised City's Project Cost Estimates and Modified Some Project Scopes
- References to a 3-year Timeframe for Completion of Projects Awarded Funding

#### Background

- Staff Reviewed What Could Realistically Accomplish Within a 3year Period
- Reviewed Projects With Council Workshop July 18
  - Requesting Clarifications/Modifications to Projects Scope/Limits and Cost
  - Remove 2 Projects/ City as Project Sponsor/Partner
    - Adaptive Traffic Signal Timing on US 90A: US 59 to Harlem Road
    - Ransom Road Reconstruction: West of SH 99 about a half
      mile

### **Current Status**

- Worked With County and Consultants to Clarify Project Scopes and Construction Costs
- Commissioners Court Held a Workshop to Finalize List August 1
- 4 City Projects Included on Final Mobility Bond List:
  - **1.** Owens Road Construction: US 90A to City Limits
  - 2. University Blvd. Widening: Telfair to New Territory Blvd. & Lexington Blvd. Intersection to 1,000 feet south of Lexington Blvd.
  - 3. Williams Trace Blvd. Reconstruction: Lexington to SH 6 with intersection capacity improvements
  - 4. Industrial Blvd. at Reed Road Intersection Reconstruction

 Action to Call Bond Election in November 2017
